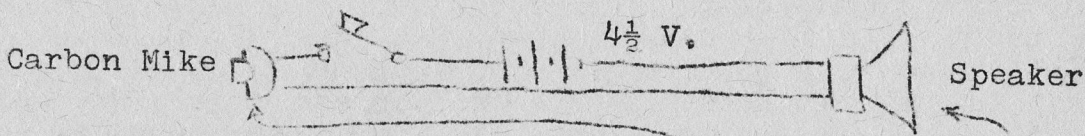

KINKY HINTS DEPT. From an Unknown Sender
IF you worry about exposed coax braid on your antennas (for instance, on homebrew dipoles and baluns for beams) just pour some Elmers Contact cement around the braid where it comes out of the outside jacket. Seals it up fine. YN Ed. refers to aforementioned sticky stuff as "Elmo's Goo-all".

Here's an inexpensive code practice oscillator:



Vary tone and volume by moving this close to this.

The local hardware store can provide cheap feet for your equipment: bumpers for toilet seat lids.

If you write your log in pencil or ballpoint, spray each finished sheet with clear lacquer to prevent smears.

STILL MORE WEIRD (KINKY?) HINTS

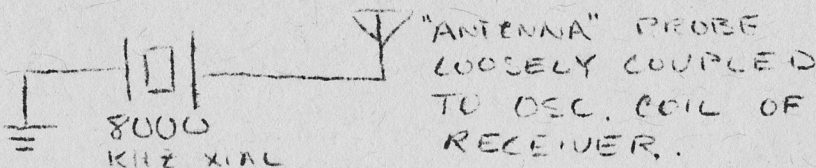
To perforate a window for a feed-through insulator, put a small ball-bearing in a drinking straw and blast forth with your strongest "hernia testing" cough, with the straw one inch from the window glass.

PG&E's suggestion to reduce ambient noise level: install a 30 to 50 mF capacitor across your receiver's voice coil. (This is cheaper for the power company than washing insulators and cleaning up corrosion on their local 60 KV line.)

Need a new meter glass? Cut it from an old window pane with tinsnips. Secret: Do it all under water (July 1961 QST--not the April issue.)

Here's a startling tip to add oil to a sealed bearing on a noisy clock or muffin fan. Heat the unit moderately in a not-to-hot oven, and while it is cooling add the oil around the output shaft or gear. Contracting air around the inside of the seal sucks in the oil. From QST Aug. 1961.

But we like this circuit from a 1949 QST for simplicity and economy. It's a band-edge calibrator for a twoer (VE3FZK and WA6ROM note carefully).



When the twoer stops super-regenerating and the hiss goes silent, lo, you are at the lower edge of the 2 meter band!

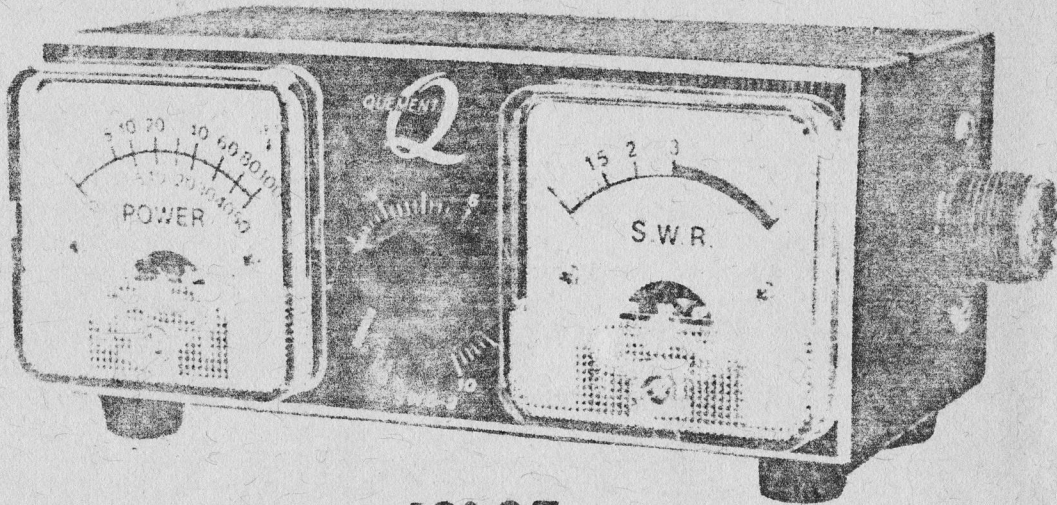
Brighten up your home-brew aluminum boxes by grinding rosettes in rows, using a drill press with short pencils, inserted in the chuck. Oh, yes, Prendergast, grind with the eraser end! (Feb '73, QST).
