## PAARA HONORS

**MIKE GAVIN, W6WZ**

### THE WOODSIDE ZOMBIE !!

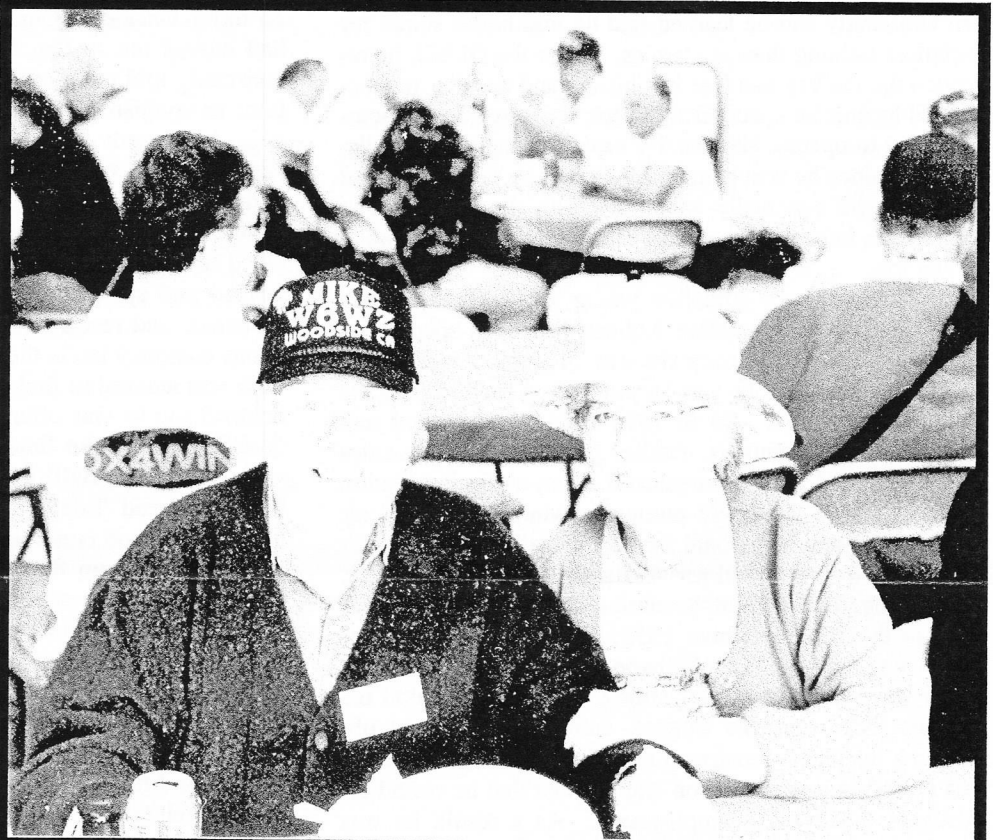
I really couldn't decide if we should entitle this interview, 'Mr. Telephone', or, 'The Woodside Zombie', as the person we are writing about qualifies for both titles. Of course, I am referring to our very own PAARA member **MIKE GAVIN, W6WZ**. It should be noted that his XYL is also an active amateur radio operator and has been a huge influence and benefit in his life. **CAROLYN GAVIN, WB6ABC**, is well known to most of us who attend the PAARA meetings as she provides the cookies and is responsible for all the hot coffee and other treats that we enjoy once a month. These two are inseparable and are one of the many reasons we have such a good time at the PAARA meetings learning and socializing.

**Michael Donald Gavin** was born in June 1934 in Chicago, Illinois. He believes that it makes him about 69 and one half years old today. His father immigrated from Ireland in 1920 while his mother was born in Chicago. He has a younger brother who is a retired school teacher still living in Chicago. Mike's dad fits the profile of the classic 'milk man story', as he worked for years as a milk delivery man going door to door and personally meeting all of his customers. He actually used a horse drawn cart to transport the milk and was only 17 years old when he met his wife, who was only 14 years old. Mike can remember that just prior to World War II, the horses were replaced by Devco milk delivery trucks. However, due to the fuel rationing, the trucks had to be placed in storage and all the old delivery carts and horses had to be brought back into service for several years. Mike actually helped his father deliver milk on holidays and weekends.

Mike's mom went to work after her boys became young

teenagers. She was a deputy with the State of Illinois, Unemployment Compensation Division and ultimately became the district manager responsible for all of the northwestern part of the State. She only had a grammar school education and was always amazed at being able to be in charge of all the college educated workers in her jurisdiction. Mike's mom is now 88 years old and lives in Redwood City.

Mike attended the Lane Tech High School which had

over five thousand young men students and was considered a technical school. Although he was learning electronics and wiring, he went to work as a meat cutter in a butcher shop when he was completed with school. He had the opportunity to work on weekends in various butcher shops from the time he was twelve until he was about sixteen years of age. He was actually a card carrying meat cutters union member, which was part of the Teamster's.

In 1950, the Korean conflict broke out and many young men were being drafted and sent overseas. Some of them

did not come home, so Mike decided that he would join the U.S. Navy Reserves at 17 years of age. After boot camp, Mike was stationed at the Glenview Naval Air Station in Glenview, Illinois, which was about 25 miles north west of Chicago. He was trained as a 'hospitalman' and actually became a medical X-ray technician. He served on active duty at that NAS for two years until he was released at age 19 and one half. He remained in the reserves for a total of eight years.

Mike was able to take educational testing at North Western University and he learned that he was better suited for technical training than academics. So, on the GI bill, he attended the De Vry Institute in Chicago and became an electronics technician specializing in television repair. He actually tried to operate his own TV repair business for awhile, however since he was being badly bitten by the love bug at that time, he eventually went back into the meat cutting arena since he was paid at least one hundred dollars a week at that job.

A smart and very attractive young lady with a Finnish name of Carolyn Emmeline Kolinen had been spending a lot of time with Mike since she was 14 years of age. Mike had known her since he was 16 years of age and helping his father deliver milk. So in 1954 they were married and Mike started working at another part time job for extra money. He and a friend organized a non-union installation business where they were putting in window mounted air conditioners and being paid for each installation. This was rather physical work and was taking its toll on Mike and his new family. That is right, because a daughter, Dyanne, was born to them in November 1955. (Dyanne is now an elementary school teacher in Redwood City).

One day, while Mike was sitting on the curb behind the butcher shop where he worked, eating his lunch, he observed a telephone repairman climbing a pole. He engaged this person in a conversation and decided that he would investigate that type of employment. As a result, he was hired by the Illinois Bell Telephone company as a central office frame man in 1956. Mike enjoyed this type of work and took as many courses that the phone company could provide. He soon was moving through various specialty trades such as resident and commercial installer / repairman and PBX wiring expert. Mike became rather interested in the land mobile telephone service (radio telephone service) and found that the technicians in that department were all amateur radio operators. One man in particular, **Joe Tenschert (SK)** call sign unknown was instrumental in getting Mike studying for his novice license which he passed in 1958 and was issued call sign **KN9TPQ**.

Meanwhile, Carolyn was graduating from teachers college as an elementary school teacher. In addition to many years of teaching, she is co-author of: "Hooked On Phonics", a primary grade reading program, well known in Bay Area schools. She had been attending the National College of Education in Evanston, Illinois. Mike began operating a

crystal controlled 75 watt Viking II transmitter and using a Hammerlund HQ150 receiver with a 40 meter dipole on the apartment building roof. One of his first on the air contacts was with KC4USA at the South Pole. Nine months later, Mike attended the FCC offices in Chicago and up-graded to Technician class and was issued call sign **K9TPQ**

In July 1960, Mike and Carolyn were blessed with a baby boy named Gregory who is a teacher and artist who now lives in San Francisco. Carolyn began teaching elementary school and they bought their first home in a suburb about 25 miles outside of Chicago. They had some friends who had moved out to San Mateo County in about 1959 and constantly told them of the great weather and living conditions as compared to all the snow and cold weather in Illinois. As a result of one of these phone calls, where in the friends told them of how they were enjoying breakfast on their deck in the sun near San Francisco, while the Gavin's were trying to stay warm and shoveling snow, Mike decided to make a trip to California. So in June 1963 Mike arrived and spent a week with his friends in South San Francisco and researched the possibility of finding a telephone company job in the Bay Area.

He was amazed to find that his services and skills were in demand and he was offered jobs on the spot because of his qualifications. Mike flew home and applied for a transfer within the 'Ma Bell' system which included the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company. Mike waited eight long months and continually requested the transfer without any response from the Illinois Bell Telephone Company. Finally, it was Carolyn who called the Vice President of Illinois Bell and had a rather nice but lengthy conversation with him regarding the hardship that they were creating for her family in not allowing the transfer. In less than one half of an hour Carolyn heard back from the Vice President who calmly advised her that Mike could report for duty at his new job in Mountain View, California in ten days !!

In March 1964, Mike and Carolyn and family drove across country with the kids and had their effects transported by train. They stayed with their friends in SSF temporarily while Mike commuted to Mountain View. Mike drove his car up onto San Bruno mountain to work a Chicago ham via HF one day and had occasion to meet a local ham on the air. This man, **Stanley Harris, K6RWA (SK)** invited Mike and Carolyn to his 37 acre estate in Woodside. Carolyn really did not want to go as she was fed up with these stogy old men hams, however Mike convinced her to at least go for lunch that one time. That was a turning point in their lives as Mr. Harris, who was an eccentric older millionaire offered them a place to live on his property for \$150. a month in a large, well maintained home known as 'the light house'. All he wanted in return was for Mike to operate his amateur radio station at certain times for a radio schedule. Mr. Harris had dual Collins stations at dual operating positions with two 90 foot towers equipped with state of the art beams and sterba curtains antennas. (It was re-

vealed that during the second World War, this facility was used by the Government as a secret information gathering and surveillance radio station). Mr. Harris also had a butler, chauffeur, cook, caretaker and gardener on the premises to look after things whether or not he was living on the property.

Mike and Carolyn eventually purchased their own property in the Woodside area where they live today. The house has been completely refinished and built out over the years and is considered one of the really nice, expensive homes in the area. It is equipped with a 40 foot tower supporting a Hy-Gain 3 element tri-bander and a 40 meter full size dipole and directional Yagi. Mike is extremely handy and has completed much of the work around the home by himself with a little help from **Stan Towle, WA6ZGI**, another PAARA member who was profiled in this publication several months ago.

In June 1964 Mike up-graded his license to General class and was issued call sign **WB6KJE**. Although this license class had full privileges at the time it was issued, the FCC started the incentive licensing program which took away some of the General class operating ability because the Advanced and Extra class licensees did not want the General class to have such broad privileges. Mike has since earned his Extra class license and was issued call sign **W6WZ** in October of 2002.

Mike retired from the telephone company in 1985. However, in 1987 he returned to work for the County of San Mateo as their in house telephone engineer where he stayed for another nine years. He was responsible for all of the County's telephone systems including the telephone taps and other forms of surreptitious electronic eavesdropping devices that may or may not have been used by the various law enforcement agencies. As you know, he is sworn to secrecy regarding that particular issue.

Carolyn has been coming to PAARA meetings for a long time and was never really that interested in radio until she heard the presentation of Mr. Lee who was in New York during the 9-11 tragedy. When she discovered that all of the regular communications methods were totally useless she decided to earn her amateur radio license, which she did in May 2002 where she earned her Technician class and was issued call sign **WB6ABC**. She up-graded to General class in January 2003 and is currently working toward her extra class license. Congratulations to Carolyn. What a great team these two make.

When you see either Mike or Carolyn at the PAARA meetings or Mike at the license testing sessions where he is an accredited VE, please do not hesitate to say hello. They are the kind of people who make the amateur radio service and our club what they are today. We, the members of PAARA are very proud and happy that both of you are members and friends.

### AN EXPLANATION OF FIELD DAY RESULTS AS PUBLISHED IN DECEMBER QST

Some of you hardy field day enthusiasts will note that W6OTX is missing in the listing of 2003 field day results for class 2A, see QST, December 2003, page 89. We are, however, listed in the web site results with a score of 8,740, placing us with the eleventh best score in 2A, first in the Pacific Division, and approximately twice the score of the next highest competitor for the local field day plaque, namely FARS, K6YA, with a score of 4,024. Not far behind was San Mateo Radio Club with 3,792. WHAT HAPPENED?? Well first of all thanks to Ron Chester, W6AZ, for checking the website results back in October and alerting us that something had gone wrong. An E-mail by Andreas, N6NU, confirmed that ARRL had no record of our submittal. However, I had a post office receipt, for express mail, dated 29 July, (the final day for submittal under the rules), as well as a return receipt requested card dated 30 July and by JW at ARRL! On the October 7, the W6OTX cover sheet and post office receipt were FAX'ed to ARRL and our score subsequently was added to the web site results. ARRL's explanation was that the submittal must have gotten lost in the mailroom. Unfortunately, this is not the first time this sort of thing has happened. PAARA did not get credit for submitting electronically in 2001, a situation that led me to never trust that form of submittal alone and always submit our entry by registered mail with return receipt requested. Submitting the entry a few days before the deadline might reduce the anxiety at this end, but I don't think it would keep the mail from getting lost at the other end. In any case, before too long someone else will be submitting the FD score and I hope a word to the wise is sufficient. I have provided elsewhere for PAARAGraphs, a spreadsheet for 2A, slightly edited so the 3 highest SCV participants are shown. It was without a doubt, our best FD score ever, although my records only go back to 1987. I hope the trend continues next year.

On behalf of the people who use Handiham services, other donors, volunteers and staff, please accept my gratitude for your \$500.00 gift in honor of Kitty Hevener. Please know it is very much appreciated.

I thought you might like to know what our office has been up to this year. Hope I don't write too much!

We made significant strides in providing emergency services training available to the Handiham System:

- Phil Temples, K9HI, the ARRL EMA Section Manager and a Handiham donor and volunteer, sought and received permission to modify and use the ARRL Emergency Services introductory course at California Radio Camp. It was taught for the first time at the March, 2003 session at Camp Joan Micr in Malibu. Camper response was excellent - they want more!
- With the greater emphasis on public service communications following 9-11, we have seen the need for more public service communications training. We have successfully implemented on-the-air training simulations at both Minnesota and California radio camps. The Boston Amateur Radio Club allowed us to modify the scripted training used for the Boston Marathon communications, so we adapted it to our needs and engaged people with disabilities as effective communicators.

The Handiham System has made a renewed commitment to blind hams. This year we moved from older, less effective means to serve blind hams to new ones that are faster and more efficient. Since blind hams depend on audio for their license study materials, ham radio news, and operating manuals for radios and other equipment, the Handiham System has been building a cadre of ham radio volunteer readers who read for blind hams in digital audio formats. This has allowed us to provide audio on compact disks in MP3 format with logical file names, such as "memories.mp3" and "vfo.mp3", making it possible for blind computer users to quickly find the correct part of the instruction manual! Instead of blind hams waiting for months to receive old

news via QST on tape, our blind members are now served with QST and WORLDDRADIO digests in digital audio, right on the Handiham website, in a members-only section designed to protect copyrights. The Handiham digest audio comes out at the same time as most hams are getting QST and WORLDDRADIO in their mailboxes.

Once again, please know that we deeply appreciate this gift in honor of Ms Hevener.

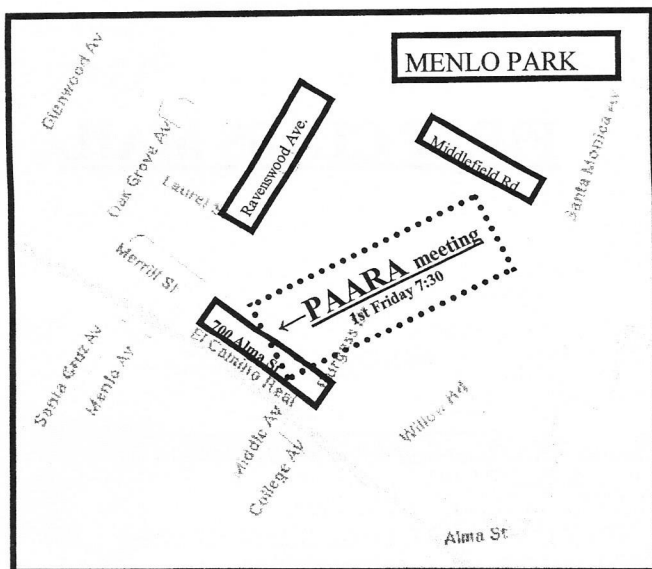
