Russ Bentson Bio

- Russ Bentson, K6KLY was first licensed in 1957, has held every level of FCC amateur radio license. Has been in every June VHF contest since 1959. He holds the Pacific Division Single Operator high power record for the June VHF contest and is currently the only operator in the Pacific Division with 10 band DXCC, with over 2400 band countries. Russ is the first past president of the NCDXC, and a ARRL QSL card checker. He holds WAS #212 on 6 meters, and VUCC on 6 meters and 10 GHZ. Russ is a member of the DXCC #1 club. During the 1980s Russ operated the CQWW phone contest from several countries, and placed 14th in the world in 1982. He also holds the call P40LY in Aruba. Currently Russ is working on a VUCC on 2meters and getting very close.

Pacificon, the ARRL Pacific Division Convention, is coming up right after CQP. In fact, it's the following weekend. Right before that, though, is the PAARA meeting. K6MDD D-Star System Status

On Tuesday, Sept 17, we got up to the site for the first time since the [Ed: Mt. Diablo] fire and saw first hand the condition of the equipment. It was depressing to say the least. A black soot was over everything and several pieces of equipment had charring all over them. Much of the feed lines were burnt and will need to be replaced or fixed.

I pulled all of the equipment on Tuesday. The D-Star Controller looks like it may be lost. Icom has asked me to send them all of the D-Star equipment for them to look at and advise me on what should be done. I will bring the D-Star equipment to HRO on Monday and they will assist in sending it back. I very big thank you to them for making this offer.

The filters, duplexer, power amp, preamp and Gateway CPU may need to be repaired or replaced.

The BUILDING at the Site is in BAD shape and will either need to be replaced or repaired before we can re-install any equipment.

The Site Owner wants us back and knows the service to the Ham Community that is provided by the K6MDD D-Star System.

The AC power is still off on the top of North Peak and several power poles need to be replaced in order to have power restored.

I have the insurance claim process started. I'm not sure what will happen with it or how long it will take.

A Simplified Direction Finder

I got this idea a long time ago from a 1974-edition of the ARRL's *"Hints and Kinks" for the Radio Amateur*. It was from an article (...same title as above) written by Bob Davis, K4BRD. Total credit goes to him and to WA4BRY where Bob originally got the idea from.

What it was was a commonly mounted *earth-globe*, say 9 – 15-inches in diameter, those normally seen in a library or den but modified slightly to yield useful beam-heading antenna-pointing information especially for the DXer.

What you do is carefully dismount the globe from its N-S pivot points



and support. Then drill a small hole at your home QTH that will accept the pivot-point on the globe. Then drill another hole at the exact opposite end of the globe for the other pivot point.

Next carefully replace the globe back into its support but pivoted around your QTH as its "new North pole." Check the rotation, making sure it is 'true' and that there is no binding. As was Bob's original referenced above, my support was



graduated in degrees with the zero at the equator.

Using this 'zero' I drew in a 'new' equator around my globe using a black Sharpie-pen.

Next I indicated the cardinal (NEWS) compass points around the new equator.

East and West were easy as those proved to be the intersections with the original equator. North and South was almost as easy too. Those points were aligned with the original N and S and intersected the new equator. The 'in-betweeners' NW, SE, etc., were 'eyeballed' in

equidistant from the NEWS cardinal points.



This became a dream to use. To date I have simply placed the desired DX location (...no matter where or how rare) directly under the support arm. The approximate direction and beam-heading is immediately indicated on the 'new' equator.

A quorum was present.

President's Report: Kristen K6WX reported that the September 6th General Meeting was well attended and that the presentation on PhoneSat, NASA's Smartphone Nanosatellite by Ken Oyadomari, KK6EIQ interesting and well received. She also talked about having to rebuild, and replace the board mail server. Further discussion was conducted on adding the ability to do mass emails to all members, present and or past, when needed.

Kristen also reported that the web site is almost ready to offer Paypal payment for new memberships and renewals. The site will also offer merchandise for sale. As there are a few remaining items to address, the board voted to make the "go live" date November 1st.

On a continuing theme, the board wishes to invite the general membership to consider having your submissions published in upcoming issues of PAARAgaphs. Any projects, technical articles, hints n kinks, DX, on the air experiences that might be of interest? We can even help you write them up!

Vice President's Report: Marty W6NEV informed us that the presentation for the October meeting will feature Russ Bentson, K6KLY, on Meteor Scatter Propagation and communications using FSK441. He's also looking for a November speaker so if anyone has any ideas, contact Marty.

Secretary's Report: Jim KI6KVV reports that there were three new members and two renewals at the September 6th meeting. He also reports that there are 148 members and 3 that have renewed for 2014 bringing the total to 151 current members.

Treasurer's Report: Ron W6AZ reported that club finances are healthy and that the flea market "season" is over. There was renewed conversation on the clubs 501(c)(4) tax exempt status and the wording needed to fill out a government form he received.

Marty W6NEV updated the board on PAARA's participation at Pacificon. PAARA will be setting up 2

HF stations, a tower trailer and antennas to support the operation of W6P during Pacificon. He met with MDARC to solidify who is responsible for what. He does need volunteers to help setup on Friday October 11th and to help dismantle on Sunday the 13th. Anyone wishing to help or operate should contact Marty.

Under New Business, Kristen points out that it's that time of year again when our election cycle for club officers for 2014 commences with the September Meeting appointment of our Election Committee Chairman. The Chairman will then in turn assemble the committee and open the agenda with nominations in the October meeting, which will close in November for the December election.




