FCC AMENDS LOGGING REQUIREMENTS
The following Appendix, to Part 97, as amended, is reprinted verbatum:-

Appendix 97.103 of Chapter I of Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulation is amended to read as follows:

97.103 Station Log Requirements
an accurate legible account of station operation shall
be entered into a log for each amateur radio station.(con't-)

FCC LOGGING CHANGES CON'T

The following items shall be entered as a minimum:

(a) The call sign of the station, the signature of the station licensee, or a photocopy of the station license.

- (b) The location and the dates upon which fixed operation of the station was initiated and terminated. If applicable, the location and dates upon which portable operation was initiated and terminated at each location.
- (1) The date and time periods the duty control operator for the station was other than the station licensee, and the signature and primary station call sign of that duty control operator.
- (2) A notation of third party traffic sent or received, including names of all third parties, and a brief description of the traffic content. This entry may be in a form other than written, but one which can be readily transcribed by the licensee into written form.
- (3) Upon direction of the Commission, additional information as directed shall be recorded in the atation log.

HAM TINKERNEERING No.2 By Jerry WA6LIJ To keep screws and parts in sequence when disassembling ham gear use a piece of heavy paper folded accordian style. Place parts in the valleys as they are removed. In an emergency, plastic tubing can be obtained by removing the core of short pieces of plastic clothes line. Short pieces of copper tubing can be "pressed" (ouch!) into service as electrical wire connectors. Slip tubing over joint of 2 wires and squeeze with vise grip pliers. (From Popular Mechanics Jan-June '74).

Many a Ham's third hand: Attach a suction cup to a wooden clip-type clothes-pin and fasten to any smooth surface. Clothes-pin makes an excellent vise for soldering. Con't, HAM TINKERNEERING CONOT.....

Dead man anchors for guy wires can be made by inserting an old piston into a bucket of concrete leaving the connecting rod partially exposed to provide an eye for the guy wire.

Turnbuckles used with guy wires seem to work loose in the slightest breeze. Solution -- after you tighten the turnbuckle to your satisfaction, slip a piece of heavy wire through the rings and center of the turnbuckle and twist ends of the wire together. This prevents relative twisting of rings and center of the turnbuckle.

Cork slab and straight pins make an excellent breadboard for ham projects. Pins are good cheap soldeing terminals. (Popular Electronics Oct 73 and April '74).

Tarnished UHF and BNC connectors often show poor electrical contact. To "fix it" dip the connectors into jewelry cleaner. This cleaning solution works equally well on PC board edge connectors, rotary switches, transistors, and IC sockets.

Fred, K6EER, has this contribution: An old cap from a toothpaste tube fits nicely into the "cavity" left in your mobile
antenna mount when the antenna is absent. This prevents
moisture and debris from accumulating in the mount.

Keep those ham gimmicks flowing---

TIMELY TIPS TO THE TROOPS


Quite some time ago I had a requirement to set up an antenna and equipment with capability of covering the eleven western states on a two and also a three megacy---oops mega-Hertz frequency. To make a long story short the house was quite a bit shorter than the doublet and it was not possible to install masts at the property lines. The illustration (next page) shows how the problem was solved. Get yourself a ruler using one inch to the foot and note how it is possible to get an extended length with very little loss of height without further extending the mast. Guying as illustrated makes a very safe method with the

least amount of fuss. This method works as well for a doublet and a long wire.


You will note that using a thirty foot mast and placing at the indicated angle you lose about seven and a half feet in height but gain twenty good feet in the horizontal. There is the obvious advantage of the inner guys acting as a sling so that the weight of the mast acts to keep the antenna tight and the single vertical guy is neater.

I will admit that the house looked like a beleagured grasshopper frustrated in unrequited ecstacy -- but it was amazing how many people really noticed it. I shall be glad to give a hand to anyone interested in setting up a long wire.



This first one is a 3-ampere supply:




This low current (1.2 amp) is great for the low-power two-meter FM stuff:
