Minutes of the General Meeting of PAARA/MP CD Club.

DE Hal, W6DEF

Meeting was called to order by our president. Twenty-five people were present. Minutes of the previous Board meeting were read, and visitors were introduced. Jerry Starkey, WA6LIJ told of the rules for the Sweepstakes Contest to be held November 2 and 3 for CW and the 16 and 17 for phone. This was explained to be a national and club-oriented contest. Log sheets were passed out.

Motion made by Jerry Starkey WA6LIJ and seconded by Andy Korsar VE3FZK/W6 that the Club purchase safety belts, two of them, at a cost not to exceed \$70.00 for use in climbing towers and for the repair of beams.

Much discussion followed and finally the Club voted in favour of the motion.

Treasurer's report was read by Paul Churchill, W6QBY. We did great financially as well as socially in the best event of the year -- the PAARA Auction.

Fred Canham announced the Nominating Committee. These are Terry Conboy, Jerry Starkey, Jerry Wagstaffe, Gerry Tucker, Lee Zalanik, and Dave Harper. Go to it!!

Our speaker was introduced and told of the Sisters Cities Program as far as Amateur Radio is concerned. Chuck had many beautiful slides of Africa and gave a fine talk.

Hal Moore, our E.C. tells me that he is participating in OPERATION HANDLE, which is a monthly message sent out by the federal disaster assistance administration and others to develop an alternate to telephone communications in time of disaster. The ARRL and MARS all participate. Nice to hear of Hal's good work.

FAARA HAM ASSISTS IN PERU EARTHQUAKE

During the morning of Thursday, October 3 a telephone call was received at the home of W6DEF from WA6DBT, Jack Brooks, the Chief Engineer of international shortwave radic station KGEI. He asked that the National Traffic System be alerted to messages coming from Lima, Peru as a result of KGEI to Lima. This is because of an earthquake which apparently just occured down there.

W6DEF, said he'ld be glad to put out a "QNC" (all stations copy) on the Northern Cal. Net. There was some correlation going on on two meters FM also.

During the afternoon the Cakland Red Cross on the repeater W60T came on and asked if some-one would go to westcars and ask them to broadcast an appeal to provide a link to Westcars, from the Red Cross to the 40 meter net. W60T had been in direct contact with Lima on 15 but need connection to 40 meters so local information could be passed. W6DEF, hal, got Wescars activated along with W6VXJ and they broadcast the appeal of W60T every 15 minutes, as requested.

A 45 word QNC was transmitted by W6DEF on NCN/1 and NCN/2 that evening. The local Red Cross had been called and an offer made that if anyone wished to speak in Spanish to a cassette tape recorder W6DEF could transmit it on a repeater so KGEI could beam it to Peru. There were no takers, but the service was available.

We all know now that the earthquake in Peru was a relatively minor wave. Also few relatives of the people in that country live here. However, it MIGHT have been as severe as the one in Mexico.

THE TINKERING HAM

after Jerry WA6LIJ

Ever find yourself needing a good shim that was slightly compressible (5.33%), truly flexible, and was 1.257" thick, yet reducible in 0.0035" increments (0.00175" if you have a sharp knife) over the entire range (1.257" to 0"), and with the approximate dimensions of 9.50"l x 6.50"w? Such shims, while fairly popular, are difficult to find -- unless you know where to look. Try your bookshelf, and notice that the 1970 ARRL Radio Amateur's Handbook fulfills these requirements perfectly.

Normally you'll find that each page is 0.0035" thick (t moisture in the air), except for the covers which are 0.0125" each. So if you need a 1.257" whim, whe handbook will do fine. However if a smaller shim is needed (in multiples of 0.0035") use this handy formula:

 $\frac{1.257"-x}{0.0035} = \text{pages to be removed} \qquad \text{(Equ. 1)}$ $\frac{0.0035}{\text{where } x = \text{shim thickness desired}}$ $\frac{1.257"-x}{\text{Example; If a 0.207" shim is needed}} = \frac{1.257"-0.207"}{0.0035}$

If increments of 0.00175" are required, use Equation to calculate to the nearest page above needed measurement, then take a sharp knife and split a page in half (Extake out page #41, but leave page #42). Because of the smoothness of the covers, it is recommended that these not be removed unless necessary — the smooth surfaces will assist your placing of the book.

300 pages to be removed.

In the event of a mis-calculation, where the thickness is less than desired, dip the book in luke-warm water, until desired measurement is reached. If this also fails, ask to borrow Jerry's book, and then give it another try!



SIMPLE CIRCUITS

That looks like a diode. Ye. The secret is where you put the blasted thing. It may save you a \$10.00 IC. Many keyers, radios, and calculators have a jack for and external battery. Simply cut the positive wire f from the jack and connect point B of the diode to it. Then connect point A to the jack. If someone misconnects your battery, it won't work, but better yet, your junk won't burn out. If your circuit can't stand the 1V drop across the diode, connect the point B (Con't --)

to the plus lead on the jack and point A to the minus lead.

This is hard on a misconnected battery but it does the job. (It will also blow Hell out of the diode..Ed)

OH NO--AMOTHER HORRID FM TRICK



The oscillator tube is not critical; any pentode will work.


Close the switch for AM (PAARA net) Operation.
