Meeting will be on January 7, a FRIDAY, at 7:30 PM at the Menlo Park Recreation Center. In addition to the above features, the funfilled PAARA raffle and goodies will be forthcoming. THE NEWLY SWORN-IN BOARD OF DIRECTORS will meet in the amazing PAARA steel coffin with wheels at SRI on the following Wednesday, January the 12th at 7:30 PM to answer the age old question that arises this time of year--Who gets to sit next to the heater? mailing list

Program for the Christmas Party was outlined. Voted to spend \$25 on ladies' gifts, which will be purchased by Steve and YLs.

SET plans tenatively made. Steve will prepare messages and route assignments for mobiles participating. (Details on page 4.)

Suggested that a promotion to get more members wearing badges at the club meetings. Fred will coordinate purchases.

PACIFIC DIVISION DIRECTOR'S MEETING was held on December 4th in San Jose. Erv Rasmussen, W6YPM, attended as our representative.

A report was given on Bill Eitel. He has returned home after several surgeries.

New ARRL training films are available from W6VZT.

Area emergincy coordinator K6ITL advised that a directory will be available. The following are emergency frequencies: 3630, 3930, 7130, 7230, 28630, and 146.52. It was urged that closer ties with the Red Cross be established.

There was considerable discussion on public relations. Expansion in this field is desirable, including CB to ham encouragement.

An FCC representative was in attendance and took part in a question and answer session. De-regulation discussed.

Doc Gmelin, W6ZRJ, the Divsion Director, made several reports.

Mentioned the results of his surveys.

Gave bulletin schedule info. (See page 7.)

Talked at length about the ARRL training program. The Marin club has expanded it's membership to about 400 on the strength of it's training program.

WARC preparation reports are available from ARRL for a 24¢ SASE. It was confirmed that PAARA is an affiliated club, but we should send a list of officers to hq. and inquire about the mailing list and to reaffirm our affiliation.

The San Mateo Radio Club will sponsor the Bay Area Hamfest in 1977. Sixty delagates were on hand and received a gratis lunch ala Colonel Sanders (at a cost of only about \$1.50 per person.)

A NEW CONTEST WAS PROPOSED by WA6UAM at the division directors meeting. To be called the "Silent Keys Contest", only silent keys would be eligible to participate in the contest. (Tnx SFRC NEWS)

BULLETINS AND CODE PRACTICE AND OTHER SUNDRY OCCURENCES

Pacific Divsion Bulletins on the first and third Tuesday of each month. CW on 3590 at 7PM (15 to 20 WPM); SSB on 3815 at 7:30 PM and RTTY on 3615 at 8 PM (45.45 Baud, 170Hz shift)

LEARN THE CODE course for beginners is given by K6RAU in Merced on 3780±2 kHz on A2 (MCW) from 6:30 to 7 AM PST. The course runs for one month and then repeats. Courses in March, April, May, September, October, and November.

Code practice from W6QIE is heard Tuesday through Sunday at 8 PM on 3590 kHz.

BAY AREA TWO-TWENTY GROUP (BATT) functions to promote the use of the 220 band and publishes a nice newsletter. Membership is \$2.50 per quarter plus a one-time \$10 iniation fee, to Gil Morris, WB5KCJ at 1585 Ben Roe Ave., Los Altos, CA 94022. They have a weekly net and indicate that several repeaters are active. (They didn't say when or where the net was.)

NEWS OF K60TR FROM LOREN CHAN, WA6ENC is that the station is on the air about once a month and participates in WWJ, ASH, QFO, AND PAARA nets on AM and the QFO net on FM. The station will remain in its present location until at least the end of January. This is longer than had been expected, since the Red Cross has had difficulty selling the present site and purchasing a new one farther to the north in the county.
