

ANNOUNCING A FANTASTIC CONTEST... to celebrate the receipt of his new call sign, your executing editor is running a contest to see who can think of the best phonetics for his call. Decisions on winner will be made by N6RY and will be final (unless you think it's worth bribery). You will be judged on the basis of originality, class, charm, grace, and the whim of your executing editor. THE PAARA FM NET takes new directions. To combat a recent trend to have fewer check-ins to the PAARA FM Net, the PAARA Board of Directors, at the urging of WENIR and others, has come forth with a new net procedure. Starting immediately, things should happen more or less in the following fashion:

1. At 8:30 PM, NCS calls up stations by alphabetical groups. (A-E, F-J, K-O, P-T, and S-Z)

2. QST's and club announcements. Brief reports from officers.

3. Call all stations that have checked-in (alphabetically or by order of check in) individually for a transmission -- swap-shop, technical assistance requests, comments, news, whatever. ONE TRANSMISSION PER STATION!

4. Handle traffic between stations initiated by step 3.

5. Open net to general ragchew.

6. Net control position to be rotated every 90 days!

The purpose of the above procedure is to get more people to come out from under the covers. Everyone makes at least 2 transmissions. At the same time, the structured part of the net is not long enough to frustrate the liberal mic-button pushers in the crowd. Let's all give this a go!

Gerry has kept track of 17 net sessions in the past months, and things have been slowly going down hill. Average check-ins has been 10.2, with a maximum of 16 (back in March) and a minimum of 5 (in September). PARTICIPATE ONE THE ILLUSTRIOUS MEMBERS OF THE PAARA BOARD OF DIRECTORS, WA60FN, shares your editor's fascination for things numerical. At a recent meeting, Bill began to ponder the standard words set up to gauge the speed of Morse code. From the encyclopedia, he discovered the frequency of letters out of 1000: E-130, T-92, N-79, R-76, O-75, A-74, I-74, S-61, D-42, L-36, H-34, C-31, F-28, P-27, U-26, M-25, Y-19, G-16, W-16, V-15, B-10, X-5, Q-3, K-3, J-2, and Z-1. He then multiplied these frequencies by the number of bits per letter. For instance, E is 1, T is 3, and Q is 13. Adding all of these products together, he got a total of 6076. By dividing by the number of letters from which the frequency sample was taken, he got that the average letter has 6.076 bits.

Compare this to the FCC standard "word", PARIS. This is composed of 31 bits, not counting the spaces between letters, which is the same for all words. PARIS has 31/5 or 6.2 bits per letter. Bill further went on to make a guestimate of the frequency of numerals (2%) and added this into the pot to give a revised figure of 6.234 bits per letter. This is quite close to the speed standard, so perhaps someone know what they were doing when it was chosen.
