





### Some Reflections on Field Day

This year's Field Day was one of the best that I have seen. Although I have not seen as many as some of our members have, I am confident that the members who participated in Field Day enjoyed it. I still have no data on our performance, which, by my best estimation, was relatively good given the fact that PAARA members to the exclusion of "pro" contesters did the greatest amount of operating. The idea that everyone who shows up at Field Day wanting to get on the air will be allowed to is difficult to attain in the real Field Day environment. Nevertheless, a great number of PAARA members (and a few non-members, I believe) were allowed to operate. This certainly did not impair our efforts to keep all stations on the air continuously!

To be more specific, the performance of the novice tent was spectacular given previous novice tent QSO counts. John Gompers and Rob (sorry, forgot the call!) kept 10 meters phone and cw on all other allowable bands active for as long as the band conditions would hold out. Not only did this give PAARA valuable points in the contest, but it also showed a hint of light at the end of the tunnel as far as recruitment of new PAARA members (i.e. novices) is concerned.—de KB6BPM—

#### PAARA FIELD DAY 1987

This field day, the club participated with semi-serious intentions in the 3A class. Calls used were: W60TX on phone and CW and KA6JLT at the Novice station. There were two phone stations located in the trailer with Gerry-LNV and Ken-BPM as co-captains. The single CW station was located in the usual location right along the water under a shady tree. John-ZL was the CW captain.

We erected the 60 ft. aluminum crank-up tower and mounted the 15m and 20m monobanders for use on phone. At the CW tent, a 50 ft push-up mast supported wire antennas for 80,40,20 and 15. We used a Kenwood TS-930 and TS-430 for the phone stations and a Drake B-line for CW

All the radios and antennas worked fine. The generator, however,
was not totally reliable. It failed once, but thanks to Gerry-LNV and

his own generator, we were back on line in no time!

The Novices, I thought, put forth an outstanding effort. The novice people were Rob-JLT and John-TEM. With some guidance from Craig-ITW and others, they were able to utilize the arm of a crane to hang a multiband center fed "fan dipole." Needless to say, the Novices made extensive use of their newly gained 10-meter phone privleges. I would like to note here that the novice station was on the air for the full time and made a significant contribution to the overall score.

The final unduped number of QSOs for each mode were as follows:

PHONE = 1100

CW = 300

NOVICE = 220

At the time of this writing, I did not as yet have available to me a duped final count. Bill-LZI was hard at work on his computer running a sorting program to determine our final score for submission to ARRL.






