CONFESSIONS OF A CASUAL CONTESTER DE W61SQ

If it's June, can Field Day be far behind?

In June every year, I think of a telephone call I had from the late, great contester Cam Pierce, K6RU the night

before a Field Day many years ago.

As many of you know, Cam was the father of big multi-multi contest operations, at least here on the west coast. You might remember his photo on the cover of QST sitting on the 100 foot boom (on the ground) for his new contest 40 meter antenna. It was two 50 foot towers bolted together back-to-back. This was at a time when 40 meter beams of any kind were still scarce. He built his contest station on an avocado Ranch in Fallbrook, south of Los Angeles, and when he moved to Hawaii, he sold ranch and station to Dale Hoppe, K6UA. When Cam returned from Hawaii, he spent a few years in Southern California, and then came back to his roots in the Bay Area. He had grown up in San Mateo and studied electrical engineering at Stanford. In the big pre-war radio contest days, Cam and Mike Villard, W6QYT, managed the Stanford Radio Club station W6YX. Cam was the operator and Mike was the chief engineer, keeping the equipment functioning.

So I got this phone call on the eve of Field Day soon after Cam got settled in a new house in Portola Valley. In a very plaintive voice Cam said, "do you know what day

tomorrow is?"

I thought, what's he talking about? Is he kidding? Can't be sure so I'll give him a semi-straight answer. "Lessee, gotta be a Saturday. I dunno. What day is it?"

In a quavering voice Cam says, "It's Field Day."

Ohhhhh, to be sure. Gee I forgot. You going to go mobile or something and work a few?

"I don't have any place to go. I used to organize the Honolulu ARC operation and we won all the time. But I

don't know anybody up here. You know where I could find

a FD operation?"

"Sure. Palo Alto ARA has an active group. Why don't you call Fred Canham, K6YT?" and I gave him Fred's number.

Half hour later another call from Cam. The plaintiff mode had changed to joy. "He wants me!" Next day I went to the Field

Day site. There was Cam with a wide grin, still under his big pair of ear-

phones, pounding brass after an all night stint. He didn't stop even to say, "hi". He just kept smiling and logging. A little while later, Cam set down the phones and we chatted briefly. "Say, there are a lot of pretty good operators here. I think we could make this club a real winner."

Cam was deaf, very nearly on one side and almost on the other. You had to sit on the best side to be heard at all. But give him a pair of headphones and he could copy CW ESP stuff. However, he would never even go into a Field Day phone tent, never mind using a mike. Undignified.

Sunday night Cam called. He and Fred had had some serious discussion and decided that Fred would rework all radio equipment, cabling, etc. etc. while Cam would develop a band operating plan, build filters, redesign and rebuild all monoband antennas. They also decided that between them they would have things so well planned that they would have to win next Field Day in their chosen category.

And they did! For many years PAARA was absoutely tops in their category. As they unloaded antennas in Cam's back yardthe day after every FD, Cam and Fred would begin planning changes for the next year.

NCCCer Fred, K6YT, still carries on for PAARA on FD. I'll bet he'd be thrilled to hear from someone who would like to take over Cam's tour of all-night duty on CW.


LOLA KAIDER WOUSE, EXTRA CLASS, DIED OF LUNG CANCER APRIL 6. THERE WAS NO SERVICE AND LITTLE PUBLICITY, LOLA WAS EDITOR OF PAARAGRAPHS AND WAS WELL KNOWN IN THE LATE 1950'S BY THE OLD TIME MEMBERS. HER HUSBAND STEVE KAIDER KETV. SILENT KEY IN 1988 WAS A MEMBER OF PAARA AND CAME TO OUR MEETINGS FOR MANY YEARS. STEVE STARTED HIS RADIO CAREER BACK IN THE DAYS WHEN IT WAS CALLED "WIRELESS". THE 1921 CALLBOOK SHOWS 1BGY (NO PREFIX LETTERS) ISSUED TO STEPHEN J. KAIDER, FALL BROOK, MASS. STEVE GOT HIS LICENSE AS RADIO OPERATOR COMMERCIAL FIRST CLASS IN 1927 (HERBERT HOOVER, SECRETARY OF COMMERCE) AND QUICKLY LANDED A JOB ON THE S.S. COMUS. HE PURSUED THIS CAREER FOR MOST OF THE REMAINDER OF HIS LIFE. SOME TIME IN THE '30S HE CAME TO SAN FRANCISCO AND MET LOLA. TO HEAR LOLA TELL IT, STEVE HAD A FINE CAMERA, LOLA HAD A DARKROOM, -- IT WAS LOVE AT FIRST SIGHT. AFTER THEY WERE MARRIED STEVE CONTINUED HIS CAREER AT SEA AND LATER WAS PERMITTED TO OPERATE "MARITIME MOBILE". LOLA GOT A NOVICE LICENSE WHOUSE AND THEN COULD TALK WITH STEVE AT SEA USING CW. STEVE WOULD TALK WITH LOLA, ALWAYS SENDING SLIGHTLY FASTER THAN LOLA COULD RECEIVE UNTIL LOLA GOT HER CODE SPEED UP TO 35-40 WPM.

LOLA WAS AN ARDENT FEMINIST AND HER HACKLES RAISED AT THE SLIGHTEST SUGGESTION THAT WOMEN WERE INFERIOR, IN ANY WAY, WITH THAT OTHER SEX. ONE OF THE MORE GRIEVOUS INSULTS CAME AT A RADIO CLUB MEETING WHERE PLANS FOR FIELD DAY WERE BEING DISCUSSED.
