## DX

## Spread Spectrum for Palo Alto

Metricom--a Los Gatos, California company--has agreed to provide Palo Alto with city-wide wireless service allowing portable and mobile computers and personal digital assistants (PDAs) to access telephone-based e-mail services. The Metricom system uses multiple, low-power radios installed atop utility poles that operate in frequency-hopping spread-spectrum fashion. Metricom operates the service in Cupertino, and plans expansion soon into San Jose and Walnut Creek.

Users pay \$29.95 a month for unlimited usage. (Interesting? Maybe hams will find a way to integrate this new communications technology into their emergency or special-event operations.-AF6S)

### **Software Radio**

You've heard of a short-wave radio, but have you heard of a software radio? Analog Devices, Inc. of Norwood, MA has just announced availability of their new low-distortion, high-speed AD9042 analog to digital (A/D) converter. The device is designed to operate over the entire 12.5 MHz-wide cellular telephone band. It samples the entire band and then uses software filters to extract the desired frequencies representing 60 user channels. This is a software engineer's idea of how to build a radio on a chip. Power consumption is less than 1/2 W with a 5V supply. Right now the AD9042 is available in a ceramic dual-in-line-package (DIP) for under \$200, but by fall will be available in a plastic surface mount package for less than \$50. In a couple of years the chips should be available cheap on the surplus market.

## FREE EMERGENCY ACCESS CODES

Access to emergency agencies via your 2-meter radio is available free on 145.230 repeater (-600 KHz offset, 100 Hz PL). To receive the emergency numbers which cover Fire, Police, AAA, Allstate Road Service, Sheriff, plus security services at many colleges in the Bay Area from Berkeley and San Francisco on the North to San Jose on the South, send a self-addressed-stamped-envelope (SASE) along with a copy of your ham license to:

Allow about two weeks for delivery. If the instructions that come with the access codes do not seem to work for you, feel free to call W6APZ at 415-494-0128. He will talk you through the process using one of the three non-emergency test numbers.

#### **NEWS RELEASE**

On Saturday, June 25 at noon, amateur radio communities all over the United States will again start their 24-hour Field Day contest, organized by the American Radio Relay League (ARRL).

Amateur radio clubs and individual radio operators (also called ham radio operators) will set up transmission stations away from the regular power grid. Usually they will operate from mountain tops, near the water and in other areas with an unrestricted view so that they can get maximum signal out. They will get their power from generators, solar cells, batteries and even hand cranked power.

Most clubs operate stations on the short-wave band in either Morse code (CW) or voice (phone). Many also operate satellite stations which relay the signal to the many amateur radio satellites which circle the earth. Others operate on packet radio, a digital wireless radio mode which works much like a modem in a computer. Just about any leading edge communication method is used and often has been invented by the amateur radio community. The Boy Scouts, who working on their radio merit badges, will operate the Novice Stations this year.

While Field Day is a contest and a social event for amateur radio operators all over the country, there is a serious purpose. It prepares radio operators to serve the community in case of emergencies, away from their regular locations and homes and without the benefit of standard line electricity.

There are several amateur radio emergency service groups in all counties of the US They assist local authorities in providing communications during major emergencies (e.g., tornadoes, Oklahoma bombing, etc.) when local authority communication circuits usually get overloaded. They also keep in practice through providing radio communication during local events, such as parades, bicycle races, etc.

If you are interested in learning more about Field Day, drop by at the Palo Alto Amateur Radio Association (PAARA) Field Day site. It is located at the Palo Alto Boat Works in Palo Alto. Take the University Exit from the Bayshore Freeway, head East until Bay Road. Turn right on Bay Road until

you pass the bird sanctuary and reach the Palo Alto Boat Works.

If you like to learn more about amateur radio in general and what it takes to get your license, come to one of PAARA's regular meetings on the first Friday of each month (July is second Friday) at the Menlo Park Recreation Center at 7:30 p.m. Guests are always welcome and PAARA members will be glad to show you the right path or will refer you to other radio clubs if these are more convenient.

Ham radio has come a long way since Marconi. This is a fascinating hobby for just about anyone. Give it a try, you will enjoy it. For further information call PAARA at 415-593-5613 (evenings) or 510-271-7587 (day).




