PRESIDENT'S **PONDERINGS**

de VIC BLACK, AB6SO

This last year has seen many improvements in the way we con-

duct club activities. We ratified a new club constitution and by-laws to bring us up to date from the older rules which had remained unchanged for nearly 50 years. Our club business has been conducted more by the Board, but reported better in PAARAgraphs. This has allowed us to streamline general club meetings in order to allow more time for Show-and-Tell, Operating News, socializing and guest speakers.

Many of our speakers are world class and because of our reputation many have traveled long distances to be with us (over 12,000 miles in one case). I would like to get the word out to more people about the quality of our speakers since this is an excellent selling point for hams who are undecided about attending club meetings.

We are more stable financially than ever before. Our major fund raisers, the Foothill Flea Market and the Autumn Auction, have been very successful allowing PAARA to provide financial assistance to AMSAT to help offset the cost of launching the Phase 3-D satellite. Excess club funds have been moved from a passbook account to a money market fund in order to earn higher income. This will act as a sort of endowment to help fund future expansion of club activities.

PAARAgraphs has continued to improve from month-tomonth so that it is now one of the finest club newsletters in Northern California. This is extremely important since the newsletter holds the club together. Advertising has helped to pay for additional pages in the newsletter. Extra copies are sent to our advertisers and reach a large audience of potential new members. We started an e-mail system to inform on-line members of club activities. This was recently extended to packet, as well.

The Board Minutes

Dave Bailey (WS6W), Secretary PAARA Board Meeting July 16, 1997

Present: Vic Black (AB6SO)- Pres. Doug Schliebus (W6HXL)- Treas Steve Stuntz (K6FS) DaveBailey(WS6W)- Sec. Fred Canham (K6YT) Wally Porter (K6URO)

The meeting was called to order by Vic (AB6SO). The June 11 PAARA Board meeting minutes were read by Dave (WS6W). One correction - Item 4 under New Business should read international Guard, not Coast Guard. Doug (W6HXL) gave the treasurer's report. We have \$5136 in the checking account. The net profit for the flea market is \$3969. We have just over 100 paid members for 1997, including new member Don Trask (KF6JMQ). Wally (K6URO) gave the PAARA-graphs editor's report. We can doublesheet the newsletter every other month. it costs the same to make each newsletter, but the postage is higher. This will allow more room for photos, ads, DX, VE, and QRP articles.

Old Business:

1. Steve (K6FS) reported on the 129th Air National Guard Open House special events station that operated at Moffett Field on July 13. The station was at the picnic grounds. Casual passersby were interested in what was going on and Colonel Steve Spears wants to talk to PAARA sometime in the future. He has a dispersed group with no hams, and, in the event of an emergency, they have no way of communicating with one another. Therefore, he said it is important for his group to be cognizant of amateur radio.

2. Steve (K6FS) also reported on the overhead projector. The Rec Center is not aware of ours and they are not responsible for issuing keys or the availability of storage. Steve will continue to pursue this issue and Vic (AB6SO) will touch base with Gerry (WA6LNV) to find out if we need an overhead projector for next month's meeting.

New Business:

1. Autumn Auction - Dan (WI36STW) looked at the American Legion in Redwood City. it will cost \$200 rent, and we need a date and proposal in writing. Steve (K6FS) wants to look at the facility. Fred (K6YT) suggested the Shriner's Hall in San Mateo, last year's QTH, because of the consistency factor. Dave (WS6W) will call Nolan Katz (KB6LT) about the availability of the Shriner's Hall on October 4. If that is not available, we will go with the American Legion Building. Dan (WB6STW) will be informed either way.

2. Dave (WS6W) said that Rich (W6APZ), Ron (KD6RFI), and Fred (K6YT) have won operating awards for checking into the Monday night net at least 20 times this year.

3. License Class - Steve (K6FS) said that Menlo College is doubtful for a location.

4. Special Events Station - The date for our 60th anniversary special events station was tentatively chosen for November 8, 1997. We still need a location, although operation can be portable. Operation will mostly be on 20, 40, and 15 meters.

President Vic Black (AB6SO) called the meeting to order, and the introductions were done. Jean-Michel (F5MMX) was visiting from Paris.

Announcements:

- I. The Historic Radio Association swap meet will be held at Foothill on August 9. Be sure to take 8 quarters for parking.
- 2. The Livermore swap meet and NorCal QRP meeting will be this Sunday, August 3.
- 3. Several PAARA members will provide communications for the Tour de Peninsula bicycle race this Sunday. We hope to showcase amateur radio to the public for providing emergency communications.

Continuing Business:

- 1. Steve (K6FS) talked about the 60/60 Award published in PAARAgraphs. This award commemorates PAARA's 60th year. To win this award, you need to work at least 60 stations between July 1 and December 31, any mode (except repeater), any band. No QSL cards are required, just a log with band, time, and call of station worked. Steve also noted that we need a design for the certificate. Anyone is welcome to submit designs. The winner, chosen by a "board of experts", will win a prize.
- 2. **Steve** mentioned that there will also be a contest for the PAARA logo.
- 3. Steve reported on the International Guard special events station. Only 4 of the 30 stations contacted sent SASEs for certificates. The Rescue Wing might have a mandatory ham class for the troops since they are dispersed during off-duty hours and are on call and must report to the base in case of a 7.0 or larger earthquake.
- 4. Vic (AB6SO) presented Andy (VE3FZK) with an operating award for checking into the Monday night net at least 20 times in 1997.
- 5. We want to welcome back Charlie (WD6FAF) after recovering from bypass surgery.

Show and Tell:

- 1. Sam (KF6ML) showed and passed around several QRP items. The Iambic Keyer has only 11 parts. The RV3GM transceiver, which uses 4 transistors, became the HFC-Pixie2 transceiver, which is available for \$9.95. He also showed the world's smallest transceiver from India and the new version of the Pixie from Conga Products. He won a prize at the Dayton Hamvention for a QRP transceiver he built.
- 2. **Jean-Michel (F5MMX)**, whom **Vic (AB6SO)** met at work, spoke about amateur radio, particularly moonbounce, in France.

Design contests for the Club's 60th Anniversary Special Events Station QSL and the club's logo are sparking an interest in members with computer graphics talent. Special events stations at Menlo School and the 129th Wing of the Air National Guard have showcased PAARA to large audiences of people unfamiliar with Amateur Radio.

Our award winning Field Day provided enjoyment to all the operators who participated this year. In addition, our club station hosted a team in the prestigious World Radio Team Championships.

For the first time we documented our major club activities including the Foothill Flea Market, the Summer Picnic, Field Day, the Autumn Auction and the Winter Party so we'll have checklists for future committees to work from. The purely social Summer Picnic and Winter Party allow new hams to meet other fine PAARA personalities, many of whom are world renown.

I would like to establish a two or three year plan for the board to pursue so we don't end up changing goals every few months. It's not too early to start thinking of club goals for 1998. A good first step is to establish a schedule ahead of time.


Looking forward to next year, I'd like to continue soliciting advertisers for PAARAgraphs so that the newsletter can come closer to being self sufficient. I would also like to get more PAARA members involved in writing for PAARAgraphs. A building column could help spark an interest in homebrewing ham gear. Perhaps a column devoted to operating techniques would be helpful to new members. I want to establish a central collection point for reporting contest placings and other activities involving our members. Above all, a member profile of PAARA Personalities each month would help us to know each other better. Any volunteers for such a job? Use your imagination and put it down on paper. Editorial help is available, so don't be shy.

After raising annual membership dues we were able to purchase a new TV and VCR for club use. I would like to see us upgrade our other audio-visual aids with newer, more modern, smaller and more reliable models. These might include a new overhead projector, a public address system and perhaps a slide projector.

We are now in a good position to upgrade our operating equipment as well. Some of our excess antennas and towers are for sale and will be replaced by more reliable and efficient designs. Newer equipment will help us to be more competitive on Field Day as well as to provide emergency support in the case of a major emergency. I would recommend that we purchase our own coffee Vacu-tainers for use at swap meets, Field Day and other club activities. Many clubs in the area depend on borrowing the containers from the American Red Cross for use at various activities. In case of a major disaster, the one set will not go around.

Hobby of Kings". More and more I hear it referred to as a dying hobby being replaced by other electronic activities. The future of the club rests with new members. This is a good time to create a membership outreach committee to search out new hams and potential hams and invite them to PAARA's activities. Along these lines, I would like for us to start working early on Field Day and other major contests to involve more club members and new hams in operating under exciting competition conditions.

Many of our members compete individually in VHF contests and major HF contests such as the WPX, Sweep Stakes, the California QSO Party and various DX contests. Others would like to compete, but are antenna restricted or don't have HF gear. I would like to field a club team using our club callsign, W6OTX, for at least one of these contests in the coming season in order to introduce no-code Techs to the excitement of HF operating outside the competitive pressures of Field Day. Our own 60th Anniversary Special Events Station will earn us notoriety among fellow hams and provide operating opportunities for hams who would not ordinarily operate on HF.

A major concern for your board is the number of members who remain out of touch for long periods of time. A member-ship outreach group could check up on the health of older members occasionally. Perhaps a reverse "Elmer" program would be helpful in getting more members to club meetings by teaming up younger drivers with older members who can no longer drive to evening meetings because of poor eyesight or other health concerns. Your commitment of a ride to meetings a few times a year could help both the older members and the drivers who are too young to remember "the good old days" (formerly known as "these trying times").

Most importantly, I'd like to see the club become involved in a host of small projects that would involve more members so that we don't become dependent on a very small corps of volunteers. If you have some attainable pet projects of your own that you would like to see the club get involved in, discuss them with your officers or board members. The meeting was called to order by Vic (AB6SO). The July 16 PAARA Board meeting minutes were read by Dave (WS6W) and approved by the Board.

Doug (W6HXL) gave the treasurer's report. We have \$5103 in the checking account, and one new member, Bryan Schryver, paid his dues. Doug filed the IRS Tax Exempt Form, read the California State Tax Exempt Form (filing not necessary since income is less than \$25000), ordered and received the Proof of Insurance Form for the Pale Alto Boat Works, ordered and received a copy of Liability Insurance Policy from Wohlers, and received an ATM card from Wells Fargo. He also presented an investment plan, distributing our funds among a checking account, savings account, CD, Schwab US Bond Fund, and Schwab Money Market Account, which was approved by the Board.

Wally (K6URO) gave the PAARAgraphs editor's report. He received a newsletter from a club in Council Bluffs, IA, whose editor, Hank (WAOZGQ) is a friend of Vic (AB6SO). They have 150 members, but only 8 or 9 attend the meetings. He received a commitment from Sam (KF6ML) to write articles on QRP. Wally also noticed a 2 meter interference article written by Vic (AB6SO) reprinted in the ARNS newsletter.

New Business:

- 1. Autumn Auction The Board approved a date of Saturday, November 1, as suggested by Fred (K6YT). The QTH will be the Shriner's Hall in San Mateo, where it was last year. The rent is \$200.
- 2. Steve (K6FS), received the emblems of the Rescue Wing of the international Guard for the certificates sent out to those who contacted the special events station. Only 4 people sent SASEs for certificates.
- 3. Dave (WS6W), said that K6EHS, WA6HLE, WB60RZ, KB6OWG, and K6URO won net operating awards this month.
- 4. Vic (AB6SO), said that Jean-Michel (F5MMX), who visited our club from Paris, will send an article to PAARAgraphs.

Other Business:

What a privilege to attend PAARA meetings when I'm visiting from So. Cal. I just happen to visit my 90 year old mother on the days close to PAARA (and NorCal QRP) meeting dates. How convenient! My wife's comment as we left the August meeting was "what a friendly group!"

If I were asked to write about QRP, three years ago, I couldn't have done it. I became interested in QRP only about two years ago when I heard about the NorCal QRP Club- and "got stung!" I wondered how I would "fit in" as these low-powered hams seemed to be a particular and peculiar group. But I was wrong! They are no different than you or me! Most seem to operate in the 100w range and enjoy QRP for inexpensive building kits (under 5w) and operating what they built "with their own hands." Some even run legal limit and still enjoy QRP "whenever." Then, there are the die-hard ONLY QRP'ers, running battery power- solar charged.

Most operation is HF CW from 80 to 10 meters. Some of us like the challenge of QRP SSB. I recently talked to Japan on 20m SSB running 5w PEP. Lots of possibilities as the bands are opening up now.

Is QRP for you? Only you can answer that question. But the answer may be quite simple. Would you like to build- again? Would low-cost kits appeal to your pocket book? Does accomplishing more- with less, challenging enough? One thousand miles per watt is a good starting goal for the QRP'er. With 100w, this will require your signal to circle the globe about 4 times!

Still want to try it? Many do.

NorCal QRP Club*, starting their 5th year has over 2,200 members in all 50 states and 75 countries. The question is do you want to be one of us? Try it- you may learn to like it!

"Does it seem a full two years ago that the atom bombs first fell, Japan surrender, and amateur radio was reactivated with its first postwar privileges — the 2 ½-meter band? The world has had to make many readjustments since that time, and so have we as amateurs. Witness that we no longer have a 2 ½ meter band as such, it having been shifted to 2 meters. Nor do we have a 5-meter band — it is now "six," with promise of a WAS soon. We have numerous new microwave bands. We have a smaller 10-meter band, a new one at 11 meters. We have every prospect of a new and very interesting assignment at 21 Mc.

Change—that's the word. The whole world changes, and we must move with it. Actually amateur radio is composed mostly of changers, men who were not satisfied with the state of the art—technically, theoretically, regulation-wise or from an operating standpoint. And we have moved ahead; changes makes progress. Most of us are pioneers in one way or another.

Yet we've always had a small group of amateurs who didn't want changes. They insisted c.w. would never replace spark, balked at crystal control; fought the d.c. regulations, cried that our 1929 bands would never support amateur radio and therefore predicted its immediate doom. They scoffed at "microwaves" (then almost everything above 14 Mc.) and when the utility of such bands was demonstrated, they were first to protest the outlawing of modulated oscillators there. Who was it said that the only difference between a rut and a grave is in the dimensions."
