#### **Apartment DX-ing DE K6WX**

I woke up at 6:30 this morning, as I do most mornings. I usually take my prescription sleep drugs at that point and then scan the HF bands before reading a book until the drugs take effect. For a couple of months I've been hearing this guy on at about 6:30am on the CW part of the 40 meter band. I've noticed that fall and winter mornings are good times for 40m DX. This station was in Indonesia near Jakarta and this would be a new country for me, so I really wanted to work him. His signal was loud enough so I thought that I could reach him with my amplifier from the apartment. The problem was that he was typically only on for 5 or 10 minutes at a clip and he tended to chat with people for much of the time only working 5 or 6 stations, so he was hard to catch. Also, Indonesia is kind of a rare country when the band CONDX are so poor so he would always attract a bit of a pileup, making it harder for me to compete with my little antenna, a 20' long helically wound vertical dipole that is not up very high and surrounded by trees and buildings. I



had tried to call him quite a few times over the last couple of months without success. Well, this morning I heard him kind of loud and without many people calling him. I was pretty groggy and I almost just went back to bed, but in a burst of motivation, I flipped on the amplifier, watched the tubes glow a warm, bright orange, checked the plate voltage, and tuned the signal's frequency just right. I checked the antenna and amp tuning and put my callsign out there. I called K6WX, K6WX. Silence ... again K6WX, K6WX. I heard QRZ?, maybe he heard me, but I wasn't sure. Again I put my callsign out there. I hear K6, K6 QRZ?. Maybe, just maybe ... I call him again and then the most beautiful sound, K6WX DE YB1A - GM UR 559 559 - NAME HALIM HALIM K6WX DE YB1A. 




