Tenna Topics "

Lightweight 44 Foot Doublet

Doug Hendricks KI6DS uses a piece of 4-conductor ribbon cable, like that used in computers, to make an extremely light weight QRP double extended Zepp, the NorCal Doublet. Using a piece 50 feet long, he measures back 22 feet, then strips out and discards the center two conductors from that section. One 22 ft. long conductor makes up one side of the doublet, and the other conductor is the other 22 ft. length. Doug uses a cable tie to secure it to a small brass fishing snap swivel for use as a center support and to prevent the cable from stripping back any further. The rest of the ribbon cable becomes the transmission line. The two center conductors in the feed line are simply left in place to act as spacers. The outer conductors attach to your transceiver output antenna connector. Mount the antenna horizontally, vertically or as an inverted VEE or sloper. This small antenna rolls up and fits in a plastic sandwich bag for portable use. Use a balanced line antenna tuner with this antenna. It works quite well as an indoor antenna. PAARA member Ron Chester W6AZ has worked all states with this antenna mounted in his attic. And he did it on 5 watts or less.

The antenna was originally described in the Hints and Kinks column of the Fall 1999 QRPp, the official journal of the NorCal QRP Club.

Connectors

You can never have enough connector adapters, but sometimes you just don't have the right combination. Fortunately, you can sometimes get away without an adapter. Type N Male fits BNC Female directly as a push in. There is no twist lock or screw down strain relief, but it's a perfect fit, otherwise.

This works fine for a temporary connection. Strain relief it with tape or a piece of safety wire to hold the two connectors together.


Database manager **Rick Melrose** was given the PAARA Master database on a CD, together with the labels sample and instructions to produce labels.

Should Fortune Telling Be Prohibited?

A couple of years ago, the California State Legislature tried to prohibit fortune telling in the state. They thought it was inconsistent with living in the twentieth and twenty first centuries. After receiving a lot of complaints, they quietly forgot that issue and moved on to more important matters. It seems some of the folks who complained the loudest were government financial analysts, who try to predict future business trends, and government weather prognosticators, who try to predict the weather. Both of those activities would have been prohibited by the pending legislation.

This is of concern to us as Amateur Radio operators because we would like to be able to get propagation forecasts to determine when the radio bands are most likely to be active and productive. We can often predict future ionospheric propagation trends with better accuracy than we can predict atmospheric weather. The reason for this is that the ionosphere is stimulated by both particles and radiation coming from storms on the surface of the sun. Radiation gets here in about 8 minutes and particles take a couple of days to arrive. The sun turns on its axis once every 27 days of so. Consequently, what we observe today will most likely be repeated again in about a month if it's a major disturbance that's still active next month.

Dr. Megacycle, James Duffey KK6MC, recommends a web site with a 27-day Space Weather Outlook Table located at http://www.sec.noaa.gov/wwire.html. The web page is maintained by the US Dept. of Commerce, NOAA, Space Environment Center. Jim says, "I find these 27 day forecasts quite useful and thought others might as well." Headings on the

chart are: Date, UTC Time, Radio Flux, Planetary A Index and Largest Planetary K Index. Desirable numbers for best HF propagation would be large Flux numbers and small A and K indexes. The Planetary K-index, averaged over past 3 hours tends to be a measure of current conditions. The Planetary A-index is a 24-hour average and represents overall geomagnetic field conditions for the UTC day. The solar Flux varies with overall sunspot activity and is high at the solar cycle high and low during the solar cycle low. You can receive the current daily numbers by listening to station WWV at 18 minutes past the hour on 2.5, 5, 10, and 15 MHz AM.

With a Kp Index of 0 and Ap Index of 0-2 we can expect Very Quiet geomagnetic field conditions and an HF background noise level of about S1-S2. When the K index is about 1 or 2 and the A index is about 3 to 9, geomagnetic field conditions are Very Low and HF noise is about S1 to S2. K index of 3 and A index of 12-18 correlates with Unsettled conditions and S2-S3 noise levels. K index of4 and A index of 22-32 corresponds with Moderate disturbances and background noise levels around S3 or S4.

After that, things begin to get nasty. K index of 5 and A index of 39 to 56 indicates Minor Storm conditions with S4 to S6 noise levels. K index of 6 and A index of 67 to 94 indicates Major Storm conditions with S6 to S9 noise levels. Severe Storming usually follows K index of 7 and A index of 111 to 154. Then you can expect S9+ noise levels and only the strongest stations can be heard. Complete HF blackouts occur when the indexes are higher than this.

Aurora activity begins at K index of about 5 or higher and can actually enhance VHF communications. Shock waves from a solar flare or Coronal Mass Ejection (CME) arrive at the Earth about 55 hours after the solar event. 500 km/sec or higher density can trigger geomagnetic activity. Shock waves cause the earth's magnetic field to "quiver", thereby generating an electrical field which we hear as radio noise. Note that this noise is not the same as the intermittent "static crashes" that we hear after lightning strokes.

I've had many problems with noisy computer monitors. Most computers will allow you to adjust the vertical scan rate and to move the HF frequency at which the emission occurs. Therefore, you may be able to go into your "display properties" and change the vertical scan rate and put the RFI on some unused frequency. If the video adapter is rather old you may not have too many (if any) v-frequency options, but it's worth looking into. Of course, as far as the computer user is concerned, the higher the vertical frequency, the better (less flicker) so long as you don't exceed the monitor manufacturer's specifications or run into strange video effects. The operating system (Windows 9x, at least) will usually allow you to easily go back to the old setting if things don't work quite right.




