October 2008

Fall is here and I can just feel a hint of the cooler weather. Certainly it is getting darker earlier than it was before. I have returned from Japan about one week ago at the time of this writing and somehow, while I was gone, the season changed. Perhaps my perception comes from all of

the time shifts and the fact that Japan does not have daylight savings time. Who knows. Regardless, the kids are back in school and the stores have their Halloween wares on display.

While I was in Japan I went to the ham radio stores, as usual. I took a few moments out to send KB K6WX on one of the keys that had a CW decoder attached to it. I was amused and took a picture of that. I walked down a road I usually don't frequent and found a wonderful store that reminded me of Halted. They had some old signal generators in the window and I thought, well this should be a fun store. Inside I found a table full of real multi-meters; you know, the kind with real meter movements and large rotary switches to select the range. I can definitely sense that that someone there is keeping the spirit of radio alive. I had occasion to tell one of my work colleagues about ham radio and to show him how Morse Code is still used. I demonstrated by tapping out my name and callsign on the wine glass on the table. He seemed to be impressed.

Kristen K6WX reported that many folks liked the talk at the August meeting and that it was nice to have an HF DX talk. The minutes from July were approved by acclamation without any corrections. We discussed arrangements for the upcoming Flea Market, which would be sponsored by PAARA. We also discussed a possibility for an upcoming tour. Peter Sheerin K6WEB (Webmaster) arrived spoke with Rick K6RDM and others about various web issues. He also initiated a short discussion about next year's Field Day. Gerry N6NV mentioned that the club has received a big equipment donation and discussed how to deal with it.



There might even be some good grey line propagation near the equinox.

Dinosaur Days

Per NR7X's suggestion about stories from by-gone times here's one that I'll call Radio Rescue.

RADIO RESCUE

It was January, 1960 in Chicago, just after a snowstorm. Only the main arterial streets had been cleared; all the side streets and parking lots were blanketed with snow and ice.

I had recently completed building a six-meter mobile rig and was anxious to try it out. The receiver was an International Crystal Company converter (FCV-1) consisting of two tubes with a 6AK5 RF amplifier driving a 6J6 mixer-oscillator. See schematic, Figure 1. All the parts were mounted on a PC board. See Photo 1. This converted 1 MHz of six meters to the broadcast band. I added a clip-on extension to the broadcast band vertical to make it 1/4th wave on six.

I was very proud of how I was able to miniaturize the transmitter. Its size was way ahead of its time. It consisted of a 12AT7 dual-triode oscillator/doubler driving a 2E26 amplifier, all built on a 2" square x 3" mini-box. This RF section was modulated by a pair of 12AQ5s driven by a 6C4 voltage amplifier. The modulator also was built on a second minibox of the same size. I had hand-wound the modulation transformer to make it small enough to fit within the minibox. The microphone consisted of the carbon element from an old telephone.

To check out my new rig, I had arranged a schedule with a ham friend who had been mobile on 6 meters for some time. I was driving from the North side of Chicago via the Outer Drive to my work just outside of downtown. As I drove, I was calling him, listening on his crystal-controlled frequency. I heard no response for a long time. Then I heard a faint signal calling: MAYDAY, MAYDAY. It was my friend. As I got farther south, his signal got stronger. I responded:

"What's wrong, Steve?"

"I parked at school, and I can't get out of my car!" he said. "Where are you?" I asked.

"I'm at Navy Pier, and I have a class in ten minutes," he replied.

Navy Pier got its name during World War II, when the Navy had used it as a training base on Lake Michigan. It was now being used by the University of Illinois as a satellite campus.

Fortunately, Navy Pier was only a short detour from my normal route. Steve talked me in, and I found him parked between a Renault and a fence in the school parking lot. His car was too close to the fence on one side and to the Renault on the other side to open the doors and the spot where he had parked was covered with ice. His wheels had no traction on the ice. He could not move his car and he could not get out. What to do?

In those days, I was also driving a Renault, so on a whim, I tried my key in the door of the parked Renault. It opened!

But it would not work in the ignition. Releasing the emergency brake, I was able to roll the Renault back so Steve could get out of his car. Mission accomplished! Ham radio had come to the rescue and six meters saved the day.
