



AND THAT'S THE WAY IT IS... Walter Cronkite, KB2GSD (SK)

Walter Cronkite, the "most trusted man in America," died on July 17, 2009 at the age of 92. His amazing journalistic career spanned nearly half a century, covering such events as the Nuremberg Trials, the Kennedy assassinations, the Civil Rights movement, Watergate, and the Iran hostage crisis, as well as extensive coverage of the U. S. space program.

Cronkite was somewhat less well known for his role as an amateur radio operator and ARRL member. In 2003, he narrated the six-minute ARRL video *Amateur Radio Today*, which looks at the role amateur radio plays in emergency communications and disaster relief. In 2005, Cronkite was selected to receive the ARRL President's Award in recognition of his outstanding support of the ARRL and Amateur Radio by narrating *Amateur Radio Today* and *The ARRL Goes to Washington*. In 2007, the Radio Club of America presented Cronkite with its highest award for outstanding achievement in the field of wireless communications.

And that's the way it is. Good night, Uncle Walter. We will miss you.

145.230 REPEATER CHANGES

EMERGENCY AUTODIAL

Because of problems encountered when trying to access 911 via cell phones, the 523 repeater is reinstituting the Emergency Autodial for all licensed radio amateurs beginning October 1, 2009. To make these emergency numbers easier to remember, we have limited them to only three emergency agencies; San Mateo County, Palo Alto, and Mountain View dispatch.

The San Mateo number includes Sheriff and Fire; the second number is for police and fire for Palo Alto and Stanford; the third number is for Police and Fire for Mt. View including the Midpeninsula Open Space District rangers.

If you are reporting a problem in one of these areas, use the appropriate number. If the problem is outside these areas, use any one of the three numbers. These dispatch operators have a good track record of quickly transferring your call to the appropriate agency if the problem you are reporting is out of their area.

To check your understanding of how the emergency autodial works, there are two non-emergency numbers that may be used to test the autodial.

These emergency autodial numbers will be distributed by email ONLY, and sent ONLY to the email address listed for your call sign in www.qrz.com, as all licensed amateurs are listed there. If you have not listed an email address in qrz.com, you will not be able to obtain these autodial codes.

To get your copy of the emergency autodial numbers and instructions for use:

- 1. Be sure you have an email address shown for your call sign in qrz.
- 2. Send an email to: 523Repeater@gmail.com with

the subject: Emergency Autodial. Put your call sign only in the text.

- 3. To preclude spoofing, an email will be sent to the listed email address asking you to verify that you have requested the autodial information. If no response has been received within one week, the requesting email will be trashed.
- 4. Upon confirmation of a valid request, the emergency autodial information will be emailed to your inbox.

To preclude unauthorized use of the emergency numbers and to prevent wasting the dispatcher's time with spurious calls, we request that you DO NOT give these emergency autodial numbers to anyone, licensed or not.

100 HERTZ PL TONE REQUIRED

When the 523 repeater instituted the subaudible tone (PL) many years ago, many hams did not have radios that included PL. For that reason the PL has been turned OFF for certain nets. Since most repeaters now require PL and most hams have either added a PL board to their old radios or have upgraded to modern rigs that include PL, beginning October 1, 2009 a 100 Hz PL will be required for any access to the 523 repeater.

October 2009 Board Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the October PAARA Board Meeting for inclusion in PAARAgraphs:

The Board Meeting for October 2009 was held at the Palo Alto Red Cross, commencing at 7:15 PM on the 23rd of September 2009. Attending were Joel Wilhite KD6W (Pres), Doug Teter KG6LWE Rick Melrose K6RDM (Sec, Database), Ron Chester W6AZ (Treas), Gerry Tucker N6NV (Dir), Rob Riley KI6INR (Dir), Vic Black AB6SO (Membership), Paul Petach KI6QXV (Editor) and Ed Gentry KG6KKP (Badges). A quorum was present.

Secretary's Report: Rick K6RDM presented the minutes of the September Board meeting held the 26th of August 2009, which were approved as read.

Vice President's Report: Doug KG6LWE reported that the tower trailer needs a permanent storage site. Current storage is at no expense to the club and is OK for now but, as it is at the discretion of the landlord, that may change with little notice.

Treasurer's Report: Ron W6AZ reported that the receipts from PAARA's sponsorship of the AS-VARO Ham Flea Market have been fairly steadily declining since 2004 while other sources of income for the club have held up well overall.

President's Report: Joel KD6W said he was recommending that ASVARO survey the area for a more suitable venue for the Flea Market as other locations in the past have produced better margins for the sponsoring clubs.

He went on to discuss the planning for speakers, raffles and other arrangements for upcoming events, including general meetings, and in particular, the annual Winter Banquet. A motion was passed to authorize the acquisition of the prize to be raffled off at the banquet.

The PAARAfest event is coming up

this next weekend on September 26th at Joel's. Although it has been mentioned in PAARAgraphs and at meetings, it was felt that more promotion was in order and that an announcement should be included on the N6NFI repeater.


In coordination with John Miller and the California QSO Party (CQP) organizing group, we now have an assignment to Napa County. Doug KG6LWE in conversation with Larry Rebarchik N6CCH, is working on plans to set up and operate in the county, possibly from Mt. St. Helena.

Joel further reported that occurrences at the NARCC have caused a temporary state of dysfunction in the committee. However, the by-laws are intact and we are closely monitoring the situation. Given our plans for establishing repeaters on a 2M pair, D-Star, and on 900 MHz, and for a site, possibly on Black Mountain, the problems at NARCC have made the future uncertain at best. We will have to try to make what progress we can while awaiting developments.

The meeting to plan an antenna and repeater work party to refurbish our 15M and 20M monobanders and to recondition our current KT-34 still needs to be scheduled. Joel and Doug will be coordinating on it.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 PM




