Board Meeting Minutes 12/17/09

The Board Meeting was held at Doug Teter's home, commencing at 8:00 PM on the 17th of December 2009. Attending were Joel Wilhite KD6W (Pres). Doug Teter KG6LWE (VP), Rick Melrose K6RDM (Sec. Database), Ron Chester W6AZ (Treas), Gerry Tucker N6NV (Dir), Rob Riley KI6INR (Dir), Byron Beck KG6UOB (Dir), Larry Rebarchik N6CCH (Dir elect), Mark Cohen K6EF (Dir elect), Robin Yee KI6YTA (Editor) and Vic Black AB6SO (Membership). A quorum was present.

Secretary's Report: Rick K6RDM reported that the minutes of the 19th of November Board meeting had been previously approved by the Board and submitted to PAARAgraphs for publication. The board passed on a system for getting the minutes submitted to the board, amended as needed, accepted and relayed to the PAARAgraphs editors in time for inclusion before the subsequent general meetina.

President's Report: Joel KD6W and VP Doug KG6LWE reminded the board that the January general meeting will be on the 8^{th.} (Joel said it would feature a presentation by Denise Stoops, the commercial wireless operator for the WW II Liberty ship, Jeremiah O'Brien, but that one is scheduled for February. The January meeting will feature Leon Higglns from CPI. Likewise, the membership is reminded that the Winter Banquet is confirmed on the calendar for January 22nd.)

With regard to the PAARA Website, Joel would like to include a form, using for example a blogging tool, that would enable authorized club members to submit content for addition to the site. A discussion followed regarding available software and formats. Joel has been maintaining the site. Mark Cohen K6EF volunteered to take over maintenance of the site, much to the relief of the board, and was appointed to the position and confirmed by the board.

Vice President's Report: Doug KG6LWE reported that an upgrade kit for the clubs KT-34 beam can be obtained at a special club-discounted price of \$190. Larry N6CCH described the kit and pointed out that we have another recently donated KT-34 with the kit already installed to use as a model. We have only to set a time and place to schedule a work party to

carry out the project and to repair and refurbish our 15 and 20 meter monobanders and the C3S beam.

Treasurer's Report: Ron W6AZ reported that the club had done well with the Dream to Reality raffle and membership renewals. He reported that donations have begun to come in toward contributions to the Red Cross in appreciation for the tower trailer for Field Day (a check to "American Red Cross Bay Area Chapter" with "Response Communications" in the memo line will help us show it – see donation instructions on page 41 of the December PAARAgraphs and later in this issue).

Our contract for the use of the community center is up for renewal and a motion was passed to reimburse Lynn Gentry KG6JPV for the purchase of the canopy we used at Field Day. Pursuant to the subject of club finances, the board discussed again that we should be looking at the possibilities for generating income from other sources like the club producing and selling some sort of kits, which might also be something to offer at the Maker Fair. Some discussion followed and it was decided to make a list of possible projects and to sound out the membership as to wants and suggestions.

The board regrets to inform the membership of the passing of Ed Gentry KG6KKP and express our condolences to his wife, Lynn, and to express the appreciation of the club for the many instances of service to the club, most recently Club Badges administration, and some wonderful meals at last Summer's Field Day that came from Ed. He will be missed.

PAARA/FARS Holiday Banquet

Our speaker for the 2010 Holiday Banquet will be **Professor Thomas H. Lee** of the Stanford Microwave Integrated Circuits Laboratory. He will speak on the early history of radio and its relationship to the development of Silicon Valley. His talk, entitled "From Arc Alley to Silicon Valley" was based in part on his book chapter entitled "A Nonlinear History of Radio."

Professor Lee has pictures of a Palo Alto home (at Channing Ave. and Emerson St.) that was the 1909 birthplace of the first high-tech company in what would later become Silicon Valley. He will provide an overview of the contributions to radio technology by pioneers such as Maxwell, Hertz, Marconi, de Forest, Fessenden, Herrold, Litton, Terman, Alexanderson, Poulsen, Elwell, Pridham, Jensen, Farnsworth, Heintz, Kaufman, Eitel, McCullough, Shockley, Kilby, Noyce, and Hoerni, just to name a few.

Thomas H. Lee received the S.B., S.M. and Sc.D. degrees in electrical engineering, all from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1983, 1985, and 1990, respectively.

He joined Analog Devices in 1990 where he was primarily engaged in the design of high-speed clock recovery devices. In 1992, he joined Rambus Inc. in Mountain View, CA where he developed high-speed analog circuitry for 500 megabyte/s CMOS DRAMs.

He has also contributed to the development of PLLs in the StrongARM, Alpha and AMD K6/K7/K8 microprocessors. Since 1994, he has been a Professor of Electrical Engineering at Stanford University where his research focus has been on gigahertz-speed wireline and wireless integrated circuits built in conventional silicon technologies, particularly CMOS. He has twice received the "Best Paper" award at the International Solid-State Circuits Conference, co-authored a "Best Student Paper" at ISSCC, was awarded the Best Paper prize at CICC, and is a Packard Foundation Fellowship recipient.

Professor Lee is an IEEE Distinguished Lecturer of the Solid-State Circuits Society and has been a DL of the IEEE Microwave Society as well. He holds 43 U.S. patents and authored *The Design of CMOS Radio-Frequency Integrated Circuits* (now in its second edition), and *Planar Microwave Engineering*, both with Cambridge University Press. He is a co-author of four additional books on RF circuit design and also cofounded Matrix Semiconductor (acquired by Sandisk in 2006). He is the founder of ZeroG Wireless.

The January meeting will feature a presentation by Denise Stoops, the commercial wireless operator for the WW II Liberty ship, Jeremiah O'Brien currently plying the waters of San Francisco Bay. The Winter Banquet is confirmed on the calendar for January 22<sup>nd</sup>, and the Board wanted to remind the membership that the January general meeting will be moved up to the 8<sup>th</sup> in order not to conflict with the New Year's holiday.

The Board worked out coordination for the Election for the new Board of Directors coming up at the December general meeting. Requirements include ensuring ballots are prepared, along with current membership rosters and a ballot box, etc. Nominations are currently closed but nominees will be given an opportunity to address the membership at the general meeting if they wish.

Discussions then turned to planning for Field Trips to come, including an excursion on SF Bay aboard the Jeremiah O'Brien featured in the January meeting's presentation. Other possibilities include the Computer Museum in Mountain View and other prospects under consideration.

We are in the process of obtaining estimates for both so a budget proposal can be submitted to the board. Projects to repair and refurbish our 15 and 20 meter monobanders and C3S beam are also still in the works as well as the updates for the KT34 triband beam.

Gerry N6NV has found a possible smaller trailer to add to our Field Day trailer fleet and at a very attractive price but we have to move fast.

Treasurer's Report: Ron W6AZ reported on receipts from recent raffles and membership renewals and that we should be looking at the possibilities for generating income from other sources like club selling some sort of kit, which might also be something to offer at the Maker Fair

The board's decision to have a Swap Table at club meetings (at least during the Flea Market hiatus months, November through March) in which members could bring an item to swap or sell was discussed again. It was determined that one item per club member should suffice and any transactions would be handled by the club member.

Gerry N6NV will also auction or sell one or two items that have been donated to the club at each meeting as an additional source of funding for our general fund, for trailer procurement and other similar projects.
