

Bob is one of the founders of RAI Laboratory LLC, a startup pursuing opportunities in amateur radio hardware and software. Formerly, Bob was senior vice president and CTO of Nokia. There, he played a defining role in reshaping the company's long-term R&D strategy. Challenging traditional management thinking, he brought open innovation to Nokia and built a research environment suited to Internet ways of working and systems-level thinking. With three decades in the IT industry — first at IBM during the mainframe days, then at Digital with its minis, and next at Compag in the 1990s, plus three startups — he brings insights in reshaping mature businesses into growth businesses and tackling the so-called Innovator's Dilemma. Bob holds a PhD in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and is the author and co-author of two books and several academic papers. and worked some of the same stations again as well as several new ones. Trying 10 meters, the band didn't seem open from my QTH. What little time I did have was filled with listening through the static for that elusive contact while watching the meters bounce and the steady glow of the tubes. For me, there is nothing guite like that experience. If you haven't had a chance to try one of these contests or to try a little HF, maybe even work some DX. I hope you can find a fellow ham who can make his or her station available so that you can give it a try. I think it's the best fun that radio has to offer.

Our last PAARA general meeting featured a talk by Rick, N6DQ, analyzing PAARA's 2009 Field Day performance. Rick came with graphs of our QSO performance as a function of time, bands, and operators. Taking a careful look at these data is essential to improving our performance in Field Day 2010. I think that with some adjustments of what bands are available to which operators at various times, and making sure that we have a nice, solid operator schedule, we will bring our score up to a new all-time high. Our club has always had a very competitive Field Day team, made up of the best equipment riggers of any Field Day operation I've seen, and some great contest operators. Just imagine what we are going to do with this year's sure to be improved propagation. Field Day this year is June 25th through June 27th. I hope you'll consider signing up to help with the setup, teardown, and, of course, operating! Please contact the PAARA Vice President, Doug Teter, KG6LWE, for information and to volunteer your time.

For those of you who pay attention to the goings on of the engine of propagation, our Sun, there is a new instrument that will give us greater insight than ever into its inner workings. NASA successfully launched the Solar Dynamics Observatory, or SDO, on 11 February. To quote from the SDO website at http://sdo.gsfc.nasa.gov/ "SDO's goal is to understand, driving towards a predictive capability, the solar variations that influence life on Earth and humanity's technological systems ..." This device has the potential to give us even better propagation prediction than we have currently. First images are expected in mid -April.
