

President's Corner

This year is unfolding as quickly as ever and we are now just a short two months (about 8 weeks) away from Field Day as of this writing. We have also been right in the midst of vernal equinox propagation, but the sun has been just a bit too busy.

We have had a few very nice sunspots that provided openings for some of the recent contest activity. In the CQ Magazine WPX



(world prefix) SSB contest at the end of March, 15 meters was open for most of the day on Saturday and 20 meters was open nicely after 15 closed. I was able to work Senegal, 6V7M, on 20 meters on Saturday afternoon. That was a new one for me and that sure made my day. As we got into April, there were a number of CMEs (coronal mass ejections) that made conditions on HF much worse. At one point the planetary A index, a measure of geomagnetic instability, reached a high of 49, the highest since 2006. That made the bands unusable for a

time. Using my 3D Sun iPhone app, I was able to hear the bow shock of the particle flux as recorded by radio astronomer Thomas Ashcroft. According to a notice on that application today, we are about to see another nice sunspot rotate into view. Hopefully this will lead to more DX on the bands.

Speaking of iPhones, our last meeting featured a talk by Bob Iannucci, W6EI, about his new iPhone app for transmitter hunting. It was a wonderful application of a handheld general purpose computing platform with sensors to one of our hobby's specialty areas. Bob's application makes use of the iPhone OS's Core Location services to find position and bearings. Using that information, and properly compensating for the Earth's curvature, something that turns out to be essential for accurate results, he is able to plot the results on a map on the phone's screen. This application was used on real t-hunts with great success. Bob also has some more integrated t-hunt software and hardware in the works. We'll keep in touch and see what he comes up with next.

I recently attended the Field Day team's first planning meeting. Doug, KG6LWE, our Field Day coordinator, has gotten us off to a great start as we put together all of the details that make each PAARA Field Day such a success. We discussed many of the logistic issues from radios to food. We also talked about band plans and how to better integrate GOTA station operation with our other stations. I think we will have even more of a commanding signal this year on all bands. As Doug said, this year every station gets a tri-bander! Between that and improving propagation, we will be ready to light up "Signal Ridge" in Bedwell Bayfront Park come the last full weekend in June (the 25th ~ 27th). I'm sure we'll be needing more help and we would welcome your contribution. If you are interested in operating, putting up or tearing down, helping out with the food, or any other kind of help, please contact Doug or any PAARA officer or board member.

Just a little over a month ago, PAARA lost a great friend when Elaine, WA6UBE, became a silent key.
